RESOLUTION

A New Global Order - Vikshit Bharat ! Divya Bharat !

In the 21st Century, when the world is experiencing social, political, economic, global, environmental, and digital transformations, Bharat must stand for humanity and the planet. A world ridden with war, conflicts, and unchecked power struggles demands a rational voice, which could change our present definition of progress and development. In September 11, 1893, Chicago speech at the first World's Parliament of Religions, Swami Vivekananda observed, "I am proud to belong to a religion which has taught the world both tolerance and universal acceptance." Swami Ji's speech before the two world wars was a rational voice and advice to the nations marching towards mass destruction. Since Bharat upholds the spirit of *Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam* (The world is one family), *tena tyaktena bhun̄jīthā* (one should enjoy by sacrificing for others), *etad deshe prasutasya sakashad agarajanmana, swam swam charitram shiksheren prithvinayam sarwa manavah* (All born of this earth should learn about living and building character from the ancient sages and seers who took birth in this land) and *jīveṣu karuṇā cāpi maitrī teṣu vidhīyatām* (Be compassionate and friendly to all living beings), so it becomes imperative to share our core principles with the world for a better and liveable tomorrow.

In the 18th Lok Sabha election, the people of Bharat have once again reiterated their resolve for a strong India by exercising their voting rights in favour of the present NDA government.
