Demographic Changes: A Major Threat

India is the second most populous country in the world after China. Present population of India is more than 125 crore. India is a secular state and has a place and respects for all religions. It does not discriminate its citizens on the basis of caste, creed, community, religion, colour etc. Despite this, communal riots between different communities in India have been happening particularly between Hindu and Muslims, more since independence.

Illegal migration from neighbouring countries like Bangladesh, Myanmar, Nepal etc has been going on since independence, which de-stabilises demographic balance. Reasons for migration could be many, but it has always had adverse effect on economic, social, political, Security and law and order problems of the nation. Besides affecting the job opportunities and other infrastructure, it alters the political structure. Politicians of all hue and shades try to appease Muslim community to garner votes, so that they could remain in power and enjoy privileges. It is not only illegal migration, sustained efforts have also been going on for converting Hindu population from one religion to another like Islam or Christianity.

It may be remembered that India has been subjugated by Moguls, Muslims, British etc for centuries. It became independent in the year 1947. When we look at the demography after independence, the percentage of different communities was as follows;

According to the census of 1951, the population of India was about 36 crores. The population of major religious groups was Hindus (84.1%), Muslims (9.8%), Christians (2.3%). According to 2011 census the population has become 121.08 crore with Hindus 79.8%, Muslims 14.23% and Christians 2.3%.

Today the ratio is as follows;

Hindus in Pakistan were 26%, Hindus accounted for 26% of the population in the Pakistan before partition. After partition, the percentage came down to 15%. After 50 years (according to 1998 census of Pakistan) this dwindled down to 2% (2.4 million people). Today due to persecution, conversion and untold atrocities have reduced the Hindu population to 1.2% in Pakistan. In Bangladesh in 1971, Hindus were nearly 15% and as per 2001 census the population has dwindled to 9.2%. (1974 census of Bangladesh showed the population of Hindus fallen to 13.5%. Currently 8.5 percent of the total population of Bangladesh is Hindu, while in 2001, it was 9.2 percent.)

Times of India newspaper on 06th April, 2017 has stated that according to one analysis and prediction, between 2030 and 2035 there will be more babies born to Muslims (225 million) than to Christians (224 million) in the world. In the period between 2010 and 2015, births to Muslims made up an estimated 31% of all babies born around the world - far exceeding the Muslim share of people of all

ages in 2015 (24%). According to this Research Babies born to Muslims will outnumber Christian births by 2035.

While as per reports, the effort of certain Indian political parties was to get as large a population of muslims as possible, appease them and get their votes to remain in power. In 1970s and thereafter, due to atrocities committed by Muslims from west Pakistan, they fled to India in millions through porous border of west Bengal and north East states. They have spread all over the country, obtained citizenship, Aadhar card, ration card etc. fraudulently and are enjoying at the cost of local population. They also engage in illegal and antinational activities.

Resolution :

It is resolved in the interest of national security for the protection of local population and to maintain law and order, it is necessary to identify illegal immigrants and deport them. Also various identifications like Aadhar Card etc issued to all immigrants must be checked and verified.
